Project update | April 2021

What we've been doing

Work since November 2020 has included:

- building pavement, laying asphalt and line marking
- drainage, signage, street lighting, traffic signals and barriers
- opening another section of the East West Link
- installing the traffic lights on the new East West Link
- installing the last 31 bridge planks on the project.

Upcoming work

Work over the coming months will include:

- completing work on the 13 bridges
- continuing with pavement construction, laying asphalt and line marking
- building the shared paths
- repairing the road pavement on a section of Croome Road
- completing the noise mound along the new motorway between Croome Road and Durgadin Drive
- asphalting and installing traffic signals on the Oak Flats interchange
- continuing drainage, signage, street lighting, traffic signals and barriers
- continuing with landscaping and revegetating.

Upcoming traffic changes

In the coming weeks, a section of the motorway between Yallah and Albion Park will open in a temporary arrangement.

This section of the motorway will only provide access to and from Albion Park as we continue work on the bypass at the southern end of the project.

Motorists will travel over eight of the thirteen bridges including the twin bridges over Macquarie Rivulet. These twin bridges are over 200 metres long and include 230 planks.

Access for Albion Park

Motorists travelling to Albion Park, Jamberoo and Moss Vale will temporarily exit to the right at Yallah onto a new section of the motorway taking them to Terry Street.

The northbound motorway entry ramp from Albion Park will open, allowing motorists from Albion Park (Terry Street) to travel north on the new motorway.

A detour will be in place for cyclists travelling to Albion Park while work on the shared path into Albion Park continues. To access Albion Park cyclists can use the shared paths on the existing Princes Highway, Station Street and Tongarra Road.

Illawarra Highway cul-de-sac

At this time, a section of the existing Illawarra Highway next to the new motorway will permanently close to through traffic.

A cul-de-sac will be built near Croome Lane and access to nearby residences and businesses will be maintained.

Access to residences and businesses on Terry Street near Taylor Road will be via Albion Park or the new motorway.


Access for Dapto, Yallah and Haywards Bay

Motorists travelling south from Dapto, Yallah and Haywards Bay will continue to use the existing highway through Albion Park Rail.

Access to Albion Park, Jamberoo and Moss Vale for these motorists will be via the existing highway and Tongarra Road.

Access north on the Princes Motorway for Dapto motorists will remain unchanged.

Motorists from Yallah and Haywards Bay travelling north will continue to use the existing Princes Highway.



Access for Albion Park Rail and Kiama

Motorists travelling from Wollongong will continue to use the existing highway to travel south towards Albion Park Rail and Kiama.

For the safety of workers and motorists, some of this work will be carried out at night.

Traffic control and reduced speed limits will be in place during this work. Please drive to the conditions and follow the directions of signs and traffic control at all times.

Electronic signs will advertise in advance when traffic changes will occur.

Albion Park Public School

Students at Albion Park Public School returned from their holiday break to improved playgrounds courtesy of the project team.
